 - Reporting lines


- PL.5 (NEW)

An annual risk assessment has been completed where private water supplies are used

MP.29 (Revised)

Facilities are available for staff handling raw milk and colostrum to wash their hands and arms.





• HF.6.1 (Revised)

Tethered housing systems are not permitted on Red Tractor farms

HOWEVER

Any member unable to meet this requirement would be required to apply for a derogation directly from Red Tractor by 1st November 2021

Red Tractor would then visit the farm between November-January to verify the information on the application form

Information gathered will be presented to the boards in Spring 2022


Animal health and welfare is a core principle of Red Tractor and it has been a key area of focus in this review

• AH.3 (Revised)

The nominated vet or vet from the nominated vet practice must visit the farm at least annually to see the livestock



ANIMAL HEALTH AND WELFARE

CERTIFIED

• AH.6 (Revised)

Livestock must be handled in a way that avoids injury and minimises stres
