

TOP TIPS TO AVOID NON-CONFORMANCES

We understand that you are passionate about the food you produce and work hard to ensure it is produced to Red Tractor standards. No-one likes a non-conformance, so this flyer sets out top tips for how to avoid the most common non-conformances in the **Red Tractor Pigs Scheme**.

Remember to make use of our **templates** and **checklists** which are available online. Seeing this symbol means there is a template available:

- 1. Has at least one person on the unit undertaken responsible use of medicines training?
 - Ensure you have a certificate of competence or attendance for training, which must have been undertaken since January 2018
 - > Training undertaken since Nov 2021 needs to be one from Red Tractor's approved courses list
- 2. Have you submitted your total antibiotic usage to eMB?
 - > Ensure data is uploaded on a quarterly basis and within 6 weeks from the last day of each quarter
 - > Ensure all antibiotics, including medicated feed, are included
- 3. Is vermin being controlled effectively?
 - Ensure there is no **build-up of vegetation** close to farm structures that could harbour vermin
 - Carry out site surveys on a quarterly basis and document the locations inspected for vermin, any findings and actions required
- 4. Have you documented tail biting risks and are you following an action plan to minimise tail biting?
 - > All units need to do an annual risk assessment to identify any farm-specific risk factors for tail biting
 - > Units rearing docked pigs must be implementing actions to minimise risk of tail biting and the need for docking
- 5. Have you had your non-mains water source tested in the last 12 months?
 - > Ensure the water test looks for total viable count (TVC) and coliform levels
 - > Make sure you've investigated and taken action to address any bacterial contamination
- 6. Do all pigs always have access to the right combinations of environmental enrichment?
 - > Make sure that enrichment has been provided in farrowing pens to sows and piglets
 - Ensure the right combinations of enrichment are provided. Enrichment from the 'marginal interest' category, such as chains and plastic pipe, needs to be supplemented with 'suboptimal' or 'optimal' enrichment
- 7. Is the biosecure area defined on your farm map?
 - Ensure the biosecure area is clearly indicated on farm map(s) with an overall site biosecure area and, within that, specific biosecure areas including each pig area and feed stores
 - > There must be visible markers at entry points into the site biosecure area
- 8. Are you storing fallen stock securely?
 - > Ensure fallen stock is stored in containers that are always locked (unless empty) with no leakage of effluent

9. Are you protecting feed stored in hoppers from contamination by birds?

Measures may include use of hopper covers or bird-proofing of the building
