WELCOME TO RED TRACTOR'S JULY MEMBER UPDATE

Dear Members.

Last year, the Red Tractor team started reporting on the level of trust British consumers have in the food they eat. Ever since Red Tractor was founded, our mission has been to make sure food is safe, traceable, and farmed with care. So it is important that we hold ourselves to account and regularly ask the question: do UK consumers actually trust the food they eat?

The inaugural Trust in Food Index was published in October 2021. It made clear that food from the UK was incredibly well trusted, more so than anywhere else in the world. That holds true again with this year's research – but this time there are some big warning signs.



One is the change in people's diets. Half of consumers told us they are changing the food they buy as a result of the cost-of-living crisis.

This buying behaviour is creating a second problem. While British food continues to be highly trusted, our latest Trust in Food Index shows that as people are forced to 'trade down' to cheaper brands, or own label products, they lose confidence in the way the food is produced.

As an industry we must work together to reassure people that whatever their price range, they can be confident in the standards and safety of food produced in the UK- people should never have to choose between price and food safety.

Livestock producers are being encouraged to take part in new trials of the Annual Health and Welfare Review, starting this autumn. The trials form part of the Animal Health and Welfare Pathway, which is designed to support improvements in UK

livestock health. As part of the pathway, farmers who keep cattle, sheep and pigs can receive funding for a vet or vet-led team to visit their farm and carry out a yearly review.
